MCA Students Shine in Regional Science Fair and Research Paper Competition

Winners from the MCA school science fair recently competed in the regional NC Science and Engineering Fair and NC Student Academy of Sciences Research Paper Competition held at Appalachian State University, and to say MCA had a great showing at the regional fair would be an understatement. Schools from thirteen counties participated in the regional fair, and MCA brought home winners in all three divisions of the competition!

In the elementary science fair division, **RD Johnson** (5th grade) won for his project entitled "Freeze Your Thirst" and will advance to the state level of competition in March. **Taylor Pike** (5th grade) won an honorable mention for her project entitled "What Causes Tooth Decay?" **Landon Wood** (4th grade) won a special creativity award for his project presentation on "Which Brand Pops Best?"

In the Junior Division (grades 6-8) of the NC Student Academy of Science Research Paper competition four MCA students took top awards. In the biological sciences division, **Cesar Gonzalez** received a 1st place award for his paper entitled "How Does Age Affect Memory?" **Daniel Shinault** received a 1st place award for his paper entitled "Essential Oils and Prevention of Mold." **Cheyenne Rogers** and **Silas Cooper** both received 2nd place awards for their projects entitled "Chemo 'Therapy'" and "Light 'em Up," respectively. All four of these students will advance to the state level of competition held at the NC School of Science and Math in Durham, NC, in March.

In the Junior Division of the NC Science and Engineering Fair, **Addisen Key** won 1st place with her project entitled "Rise and Shine or Not." Winning 2nd place in their respective project divisions are **Cora Branch** with "Which Age Group Remembers the Most?" **Jacob Smith** with "Shining Light on our Plastic Production," **Eliza Kump** with "Can You Take the Pressure?" and **Brody Krakenberg** with "Battery Voltage Over Time." **Cesar Gonzalez** and **Natalie Cockerham** both won 3rd place with their projects "Pigment Problems" and "How Does Age Affect Memory?" respectively. All these students will advance to the state competition held at NC State University in March. **Eli Madren** also won an honorable mention with his project entitled "Put On Something Warm!"


