Science Olympiad Teams Win at Regionals – Will Continue To State!

This year's regional North Carolina Science Olympiad (NCSO) tournament was held at Wake Forest University, and MCA's two teams (grades 6-8, and grades 9-12) scored extremely well, with the 6-8th grade team scoring 2nd place overall, and the high school team scoring 4th overall. Both groups competed against sixteen other school teams across a nine county area. Competition was in twenty-three different areas, including activities in thermodynamics, building and design, aerodynamics, mechatronics, anatomy and physiology, and map reading. From their website, NCSO "is a nonprofit organization with the mission to attract and retain the pool of K-12 students entering science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) degrees and careers in North Carolina. Every year NCSO hosts tournaments on university, community college, and public school campuses across the state. These tournaments are rigorous academic interscholastic competitions that consist of a series of different hands-on, interactive, challenging and inquiry-based events that are well balanced between the various disciplines of biology, earth science, environmental science, chemistry, physics, engineering and technology."
