We are proud to announce that we have winners at the regional North Carolina Science and Engineering Fair in all three levels of the fair! Our school participates in the Northwest Region 7, which is made up of our school, plus other schools in Avery, Burke, Caldwell, Watauga, Ashe, Catawba, Alleghany, Wilkes, Yancey, Mitchell, McDowell, and Alexander Counties.



In the elementary division, **Maya Kern**, 4<sup>th</sup> grade, won an exemplary project award for her research testing if balloon shape could make a difference in the propulsion of a toy car. Maya will continue to the state level of the North Carolina and Engineering Fair, which is normally held in Raleigh, but will be virtual this year.




## 8th Grade Athletes Recognition Night


