4th Annual Commencement Exercises

Millennium Charter Academy presented its fourth graduating class at the annual commencement ceremony on Saturday, May 29. This year's class is the Academy's largest with thirty-four graduates, 80% of whom are going to a college or university, including an ivy league school, and the balance are going directly into the workforce. This year's class additionally was awarded the highest level of scholarship awards of any previous class, with senior **Madison Lawson** receiving a full scholarship to NC State University, senior **Ivet Sanchez** receiving a full scholarship to Appalachian State University, and several other seniors receiving very significant scholarships to other colleges. MCA's commencement's theme was "The Times We Are Given," a reference to how the students, school, and families courageously dealt with the pandemic, even with all the challenges presented, and completed a very successful school year. Unlike last year's commencement, which was held out of doors as families watched from their cars, this year's ceremony was held in the upper school gymnasium. Graduates were limited to six guests each, and all attendees were masked.

The ceremony opened with a welcome statement from upper school director Dr. Jarrid Looney, and the MCA Choir sang the school's alma mater, "O Millennium, Rise and Sing!" Seniors **Kennedy Byrd** and **Jacob Majure** presented the class will, and seniors **Quinn Cullen** and Karlie Gwyn presented the class prophecy. Seniors **Delia Ferry** and **Madison Lawson** presented inspiring addresses to the audience before headmaster McCrary introduced Mr. Stan Jewell as the keynote speaker. Mr. Jewell is the President and CEO of Renfro Brands, a company which also dealt successfully with the times they were given when they switched from sock manufacturing to mask manufacturing and literally masked Mount Airy and various other cities, creating over 6 million masks in just 6 weeks. Mr. Jewell's address offered sound advice to the graduates and all those present. He said that it mattered not so much where a person went in his or her life, but more how they got there. He encouraged every student to travel through life being authentic, to have curiosity, and to have grit and work hard in all that they do.

Lower school director Mr. Michael Reeves presented the Kirby R. McCrary scholarship to graduating senior **Madison Lawson**. This scholarship, one of the academy's highest honors, is presented by the school annually to that student who best and most consistently exhibits the virtues of integrity, conviction, kindness, gentleness, grace, and good humor. After this presentation, seniors were presented to the MCA Board of Directors, and Mrs. Renee Francis, MCA Board President, accepted them as graduates on behalf of the board. The seniors were introduced by Dr. Looney and presented their diplomas by Mr. McCrary and Mrs. Francis. Once all seniors had their diplomas, Mr. McCrary proclaimed them as graduates.

Honors and High Honors Awards

We certainly congratulate our students who ended the school year on our honors and high honors lists. To receive an honors award, students in grades three through five are awarded honors and high honors based on numeric grades. To receive an honors award, a student must have no grade lower than 85. To receive high honors, a student may not have a grade less than 93. For upper school students in grades six through twelve, students must maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.75 or higher to have an honors designation, and a GPA of 4.0 or higher to receive high honors.
