From the dialectic school (grades 6-8), Sam King advanced to the state competition in the paper category, and a group comprised of Alyssa Mitchem, Kendall Golding, Anna Petersen, and Taylor Pike advanced to the state competition in the documentary category. From the rhetoric school (high school), a group comprised of Zane Puckett, Luke Simpson, and Drake Wardle advanced to the state competition in the group exhibit category. At the state competition, Alyssa Mitchem, Kendall Golding, Anna Peterson, and Taylor Pike won the H.G. Jones NC History Award, a cash prize awarded by the North Carolinian Society to encourage the learning of history through research.
